Candidate's personal statement (what the candidate hopes to achieve on the ETTU Athletes Commission):

Having started table tennis from the age of 5 years and competed in multiple ETTU and ITTF events, my passion for the sport has evolved over the years. Coming from a family of table tennis, with my father as a coach and brother as a player, I have grown to understand the importance of community and integrity in table tennis. As both a doctor and athlete, I believe I have the qualities suitable to be on the ETTU Athlete's commission, which I will discuss below.

It would be an honour to have the opportunity to be on the ETTU Athlete's commission. In 2016 and 2017, I won the fair play award at the European Youth Championships and at the English National Championships respectively. I value honesty and integrity and believe that champions can be made without sacrificing these principles.

I enjoy working in a team and utilising both teamwork and leadership skills. The English women's team is currently comprised of younger players, and I was happy to lead the team to qualify for the European Championships in Zadar. I learnt that I was able to lead a team and remain positively calm in pressure situations. I hope to use these skills to be part of the growing movement of female table tennis and be a voice for the minority and all athletes.

For the past 7 years, I have balanced table tennis with a medical degree and have recently graduated. Time management and organisational skills were crucial for me to be able to balance both careers, from administrative work to organising my own schedule. My comfort zone was also challenged, as I required exceptional communication skills during my hospital placements to converse with patients and other healthcare workers. I am experienced in having difficult conversations and relaying information to other members of the team. On the ETTU athlete's commission I would use these skills to voice any concerns experienced by other athletes, and also be a listening ear if anyone needs a helping hand.

I was on the Athletes Panel for Table Tennis England from 2023–2024 which involved collating information and opinions from other table tennis players and sharing them with the panel to improve experiences and attempt to improve athlete retention. This experience opened me to other athlete's perspectives, and I learnt that everyone has their own unique experience. It is important to be empathetic and open-minded to understand other people's perspectives. I have a passion to improve the experience of table tennis for everyone.

With these skills, I hope to improve female participation in table tennis and improve opportunities for them to pursue table tennis as their full-time career. From my own experience, many female players pursue studies on the side of their sporting career. It is important that they have the opportunities in table tennis to be able to pursue it as their full-time career, as it is the passion for many. ETTU has a role in this, in their events and their systems to further improve the table tennis experience and to complement WTT events. In addition, I would also strive to improve table tennis participation in all genders and to be a support to all athletes in table tennis.

I have particularly enjoyed the ETTU events which brings European table tennis together and have made some lifelong friends throughout these years. I am proud to be European and I would love the opportunity to be a part of the future of ETTU.

How to vote

The ETTU Athletes' Commission represents the voice of athletes within European table tennis. Five members will be elected in 2025: four from the European Championships (able-bodied athletes) and one from the European Para Table Tennis Championships (para TT athletes).

In this document, you will find photos, background information, and personal statements from each candidate.

Able-Bodied Athletes (4 positions)

Who votes: Athletes participating in all stages of the 2025 European Championships.

Voting method:

- Stage 1 (Sarajevo): Athletes from Associations that did not qualify for the Final Stage will vote online via a secure platform.
- Final Stage (Zadar): In-person voting at the competition venue.

Elected: The top male and top female with the highest votes are elected, followed by the next two highest-voted athletes (regardless of gender). Only one athlete per country can be elected.

Para Athletes (1 position)

Who votes: All athletes participating in the 2025 European Para Table Tennis Championships.

Voting method:

In-person voting at the competition venue in Helsingborg.

--> Elected: The para athlete with the highest number of votes is elected.
